JOIN THE BCC WALKING CLUB - WEDNESDAY AM

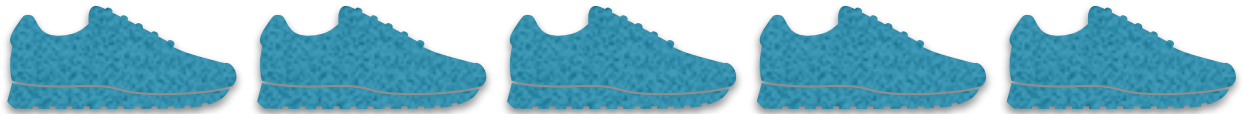
